## **About Philipp Dreber**

Philipp Dreber (b. 1980, Cologne, Germany) is a visual artist whose practice spans sculpture, installation, digital media, and holography. Trained in Design at the University of Applied Sciences Niederrhein (Diplom Designer, 2010), he worked for several years as assistant to the sculptor Wolfgang Göddertz, where he developed a strong foundation in metal sculpture, forging, and the intuitive handling of material, skills that remain central to his approach.

Dreber's work is guided by a fascination with the invisible forces that shape our world, from water, wind, and waves to frequencies and electrical charges. His practice investigates how such elemental energies generate form in nature, and how similar principles resonate through social systems, habits of perception, and collective imagination. A recurring focus is water and its anomalies —poetic symbols of transformation and potential.

Merging traditional craftsmanship with digital and generative processes, Dreber develops hybrid sculptural objects and site-specific installations that operate as both physical and virtual manifestations. His works often function as spatial resonators: challenging perception, shifting perspectives, and inviting viewers into contemplative experiences across multiple scales.

Dreber has realized large-scale public artworks and international installations, including RAIN IN KYOTO (Kyoto, 2020) and RAIN IN COLOGNE (Q18, 2023). His works have been exhibited widely in Germany, the Netherlands, South Korea, and Brazil, with presentations at venues such as Daegu Art Museum, Museum Night Cologne, and INTERART Sculpture Park. He has been awarded multiple grants and residencies, including at Kyoto Art Center, and his installations are represented in both public and private collections.
