About Filip Henin

Filip Henin (b. 1986, Mayen, Germany) is a contemporary visual artist based in Berlin and Cologne. He studied at the Hochschule für Bildende Künste Braunschweig under Walter Dahn, graduating in 2015, and his work draws from both personal memory and the traces of collective experience, exploring how fragments of perception, history, and narrative can be reassembled into visual form.

Henin's practice begins with observation, memory, and archival traces, which he translates into paintings, installations, and digital compositions that oscillate between abstraction and representation. His works often explore the relationship between presence and absence, the remembered and the imagined, and the shifting boundaries of space and time. Through repetition, layering, and subtle interventions, he creates environments that feel simultaneously intimate, enigmatic, and performative.

Increasingly, Henin's work extends beyond the canvas into installations and collaborative projects, where the interaction of space, object, and viewer generates a sense of suspended temporality. His approach emphasizes both meticulous planning and serendipitous discovery, allowing narratives and formal structures to emerge through the accumulation and juxtaposition of elements.

His work has been featured in solo exhibitions such as Is this really me! at Robert Grunenberg, Berlin (2024), Regarding Past at Noon at Robert Grunenberg, Berlin (2023), and Home no Home in Painters Painting Paintings (Online, 2022). Group exhibitions include Über den Zaun, DOD x THK Gallery, Köln (2025); Where are we now, Miettinen Collection, Sammlung Philara, Düsseldorf (2025); Nous N'irons plus au bois..., Robert Grunenberg, Berlin (2025); Elegy, As it stands, Los Angeles (2025); Folded memories, Dans les yeux d'Èlsa, Paris (2024); and IMAGINE - 10 Unrealized Projects, Robert Grunenberg (2023), among many others across Germany, France, the UK, and the US.

Through his paintings, installations, and digital works, Henin invites viewers into a reflective dialogue with memory and space, encouraging a contemplation of how time, place, and personal history intersect. His practice navigates the delicate balance between the familiar and the uncanny, offering work that is at once meditative, poetic, and visually compelling.
