

About Sarah Szczesny

Sarah Szczesny (b. 1979) is a German visual artist based in Cologne whose practice spans painting, collage, video, and performance. Trained at the Kunstakademie Düsseldorf, where she graduated in 2009 as a Meisterschülerin of Professor Rosemarie Trockel, her work has since developed into a distinctive exploration of fragmentation, distortion, and reassembly. Szczesny dissects and recombines images, sounds, and moving sequences, stretching the conventions of painting through the use of loops, GIF techniques, and sound effects. In doing so, she situates painting within a broader field of movement, animation, and pop-cultural reference, often drawing on the visual language of cartoons.

Her practice moves fluidly between the studio and collaborative formats. Since 2016, she has worked closely with musician and producer Lena Willikens on Phantom Kino Ballett, an ongoing body of work that merges performance, video, installation, and sound into immersive audiovisual experiences. Together, they create environments where fragments of film, music, and visual art collide, giving form to surreal, dream-like atmospheres that resist linear narration.

Collaboration also shapes Szczesny's publishing and curatorial work. With artist Alexander Wissel, she initiated Cabinet of Kaput (2016), a series for Kaput – Magazin für Insolvenz & Pop, which invited international artists to contribute works made specifically for an online context. The project questioned how artistic production circulates outside established institutions, cultivating an open, experimental platform for exchange and visibility.

Her work has been presented widely in Germany and abroad, including solo and group exhibitions at institutions such as Kunstverein Düsseldorf, Kunstverein Aachen, Ludlow 38 (New York), Galerie Deborah Schamoni (Munich), Deichtorhallen Hamburg, and O-Town House (Los Angeles). More recent solo presentations include Pastel Succubus at Neuer Aachener Kunstverein (2019), Sarah Loses Out Again (You Ought to be in Pictures) at Fuhrwerkswaage, Cologne (2023), and Painting will need to do all sorts of crazy wonderful things, you know, so that it doesn't restrict me at artothek, Cologne (2025). Her collaborative performances with Willikens have appeared at venues such as Volksbühne Berlin, Kunsthalle Düsseldorf, the Issue Project Room in New York, and the Meakusma Festival in Eupen.

Residencies and fellowships have also played a key role in her trajectory, from early support through the Kunststiftung NRW (2006) and Kölnischer Kunstverein (2012) to international residencies at Villa Kamogawa in Kyoto (2017), Villa Aurora in Los Angeles (2021), and most recently at CCA Andratx and Istanbul in 2024. These encounters have deepened her investigation of transnational exchange, sonic and visual experimentation, and the porousness of artistic disciplines.

Since 2021, Szczesny has also been teaching Visual Methods at IMM (Klang und Realität), Robert-Schuman-Schule Düsseldorf, bringing her interdisciplinary approach into pedagogy.

Across all these strands, her work is guided by a restless questioning of how images move, fracture, and recombine in contemporary culture. Whether in paintings that pulse with cartoon-like energy, videos animated through loops and distortions, or collaborative environments that immerse audiences in sound and vision, Szczesny's practice opens spaces where the boundaries of art's mediums are stretched, unsettled, and reimaged.
